Sponsored Online Training: Foundations in Health and Safety

NOTE: If you took this course previously, it is not necessary to view the video again.

REMINDER: Every provider, director, teacher, and/or volunteer with the potential for regular and substantial contact with children in care must complete the office-approved training pre-service within 3 months of beginning employment.

This **FREE**, fully narrated 5-hour e-learning course offers important information and strategies to facilitate and improve the safety and health of children in regulated child care programs and enrolled legally exempt programs. Child care providers and caregivers completing this course will receive training credit in federally mandated health and safety topic areas which include:

- Prevention and control of infectious diseases including immunizations.
- Prevention of sudden infant death syndrome and use of safe sleeping practices.
- Administration of medication consistent with standards for parental consent.
- Prevention and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions.
- Building and physical premises safety, including identification of and protection from hazards that can cause bodily injury such as electrical hazards, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic.
- Prevention of Abusive Head Trauma (AHT) formerly shaken baby syndrome.
- Emergency preparedness and response planning for emergencies resulting from a natural disaster or a man-caused event.
- Handling and storage of hazardous materials and the appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants.
- Appropriate precautions transporting children, if applicable.
- Pediatric First-Aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).
- Other requirements relating to nutrition, access to physical activity, or any other subject area necessary to promote child development or to protect children's health and safety.

Training learning points are enhanced by using video clips and interactive exercise.

Child care providers can participate in this 5-hour web-based online training course at any time, 24 hours a day, and seven days a week.

As you complete each 10–15-minute section, the application saves your progress and allows you up to 30 days to complete the entire course.

COMMUNITY CHILD CARE CLEARINGHOUSE OF NIAGARA TRAINING CLASS POLICIES

- Registration and payment prior to the date of the training class is mandatory.
- The number of required registrations must be received, complete with payment (or notification of registration and proof of payment) *prior* to the date of the class or the class will be cancelled.
- The Community Child Care Clearinghouse of Niagara reserves the right to cancel scheduled child care training when necessary. Payment will be refunded.

- A \$45.00 fee will be required for returned checks.

The Community Child Care Clearinghouse of Niagara will reimburse participants for EIP awards submitted following training classes, provided applications for reimbursement are submitted within the time limits as required by the EIP program. - If payment is made with a coupon, the coupon must accompany the registration form. Coupons must be for the full cost of the class or supplemented by check, cash or money order. The coupon must have a non-expired date.
- Family/Group Family and Legally Exempt providers may use CSEA/VOICE funds for their CPR/First-Aid training. Visit https://voicecsea.org/training/ for more information.
- Participants arriving late for training classes will not be admitted.
- Training class fees will not be refunded to late arrivals.
- Upon request, training database records will be given to the provider or to representatives of the New York State Office of Children and Family Services.
- For training at a child care facility or to bring a program into compliance with a corrective action
 plan, there will be a set fee, per class, charged by the Community Child Care Clearinghouse of
 Niagara to train child care employees. This fee is non-refundable and non-transferrable.
 Payment or proof of payment must be received one week prior to the training. Cash, checks

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

The regulations of the New York State Office of Children and Family Services require all child care providers to have thirty (30) hours of training every two years.

A minimum of five (5) hours of office approved training must be obtained each year.

This training must address the following topics:

- Principles of childhood development, including the appropriate supervision of children, meeting the needs of children enrolled in the program with physical or emotional challenges, and behavior management and discipline.
- 2) Nutrition and health needs of children.
- 3) Child day care program development.
- 4) Safety and security procedures including communication between parents and staff.
- 5) Business record maintenance and management.
- 6) Child abuse and maltreatment identification and prevention.
- 7) Statutes and regulations pertaining to child day care.
- 8) Statutes and regulations pertaining to child abuse and maltreatment.
- 9) Education and information on the identification, diagnosis and prevention of Abusive Head Trauma (AHT) formerly Shaken Baby Syndrome.
- 10) Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) **
- ** On December 17, 2020, legislation was signed which requires all child care providers in New York State to receive training about Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). **

Communicating with Families Part Two: Developmental Assessments (Infant and Toddlers)

This session empowers educators to navigate conversations about developmental milestones, delays, and referrals with clarity and compassion. Participants will learn how to introduce assessments like Ages and Stages Questionnaire, or observational checklists in approachable language, frame results as support AND not labels – and collaborate with families on next steps. We'll practice responses for common reactions (denial, fear, guilt, disengagement) and explore strategies for maintaining trust while advocating for early intervention when needed.
